This study aims to develop and pilot test a social work/legal case management (SW/LCM) app intervention for HIV-positive African American YMSM in Los Angeles and evaluate the efficacy of the SW/LCM app intervention in improving HIV-related treatment outcomes. Efforts will target newly diagnosed HIV-positive African American YMSM who are not currently retained in HIV medical care. Qualitative methodologies will assist in the development of the tailored SW/LCM app through iterative focus group testing with the target population. A large quantitative sample will then be divided into two treatment groups both of which will be implemented over the course of 1-year to measure and determine participants' engagement with the app. This research stands to demonstrate that mobile technology may be useful in improving HIV treatment outcomes and by assessing the added efficacy of providing SW/LCM support.

The overarching objective of the proposed project is to increase the Department of Defense's knowledge and understanding of the needs of LGBT service members in order to identify specific recommendations for improving the provision of culturally relevant health care and

support provided to LGBT service members to enhance their integration within the military. Individual in-depth surveys, questionnaires, and egocentric social network interviews will be conducted to develop actionable recommendations that can facilitate LGBT acceptance and integration into the military, and reduce any identified health disparities.

Innovative approaches to HIV prevention and treatment are critical in the attempt to control the spread of HIV, especially among African American and Latino men who have sex with men (MSM), who are at the highest risk for HIV. In a randomized controlled trial, with 6-month and 1-year follow-up, this project aims to evaluate whether the Harnessing Online Peer Education (HOPE) social media intervention can be used to increase HIV self-testing among African American and Latino MSM, and to analyze the changing social network characteristics of participants in this intervention.

High-risk male-to-female transgender women (hereafter “transwomen”) face numerous concurrent cofactors for HIV acquisition and transmission. This study will map and describe transwomen’s egocentric social networks, as well as to show how network dynamics and technology use influence transwomen’s engagement in HIV risk/protective behaviors. This formative research has high public health significance as it can lead to the development of a technology-based HIV intervention for this high-risk population that is easily accessible, culturally relevant and private.

The overarching goal of the proposed study is to assess the structure and composition of Dominican MSM sex workers personal networks and collect data on the type, frequency, intensity and timing of multiple technology use among Dominican MSM sex workers. Specifically, we seek to (1) Collect formative qualitative data on how to effectively collect information about the structure and composition of Dominican MSM sex workers’ personal and venue networks; (2) Quantitatively assess the structure and composition of venue networks in which Dominican MSM sex workers meet clients and the characteristics of those networks

related to alcohol and illicit drug use, and involvement in HIV risk and protective behaviors; and (3) Determine how technology use within personal social networks influences participants' engagement in HIV risk/protective behaviors and evaluate the feasibility and acceptability of technology-based social network interventions with Dominican MSM sex workers.

The research fosters collaboration between three UCLA investigators, a senior-health strategist from a leading MSM technology company, and a community partner that provides culturally tailored services to Black YMSM.

Specifically, the research questions guiding this project are: (1) How are the social networks of HIV-positive men structured and how does mobile technology play a role in determining the composition and structure of these men's networks?; and (2) How useful is mobile technology (in this case, an iPad application) in more accurately collecting data on the structure and function of social networks of HIV-positive men?

This study uses a mixed-methods approach to examine social networks of young men who have sex with men (YMSM) in Los Angeles County. Data from the NIDA-funded "Healthy Young Men" (HYM) Study will be used to identify patterns in the social networks of YMSM and the social contexts where YMSM gather. Qualitative methodologies will be used to supplement quantitative findings to better understand the features of social contexts associated with varying

levels of risk. Study findings will be used to inform the development of new or tailoring of existing interventions that target the social contexts that may be most conducive to the uptake of YMSM substance use and HIV prevention interventions.
