Students in the LGBTQ Studies minor program may satisfy the three (3) elective course requirements in three ways:

- Complete courses selected from the pre-approved electives list (see back)
- Petition to apply a non-listed course toward the elective requirements if at least 25% of the course content was LGBTQ-related. Students must submit a completed petition form and copies of the course syllabus and related coursework (papers, projects, etc.) to the Student Affairs Officer for review.
- Enroll in an Independent Study tutorial (“Contract Course”). Students must identify an LGBTQS Faculty Advisory Committee member who is willing and able to supervise the contract course and work with them to define the topic/scope of the independent study and the final project on which the grade will be based. Students should consult the LGBTQ Studies Minor Student Affairs Officer for more information regarding course contracts.

- \* A minimum of 20 units applied toward the minor requirements must be completed in addition to units applied toward major requirements or another minor.
- \* Each minor course must be taken for a letter grade. Students must earn an overall grade-point average of 2.0 or better in the minor.
- \* Courses in which students receive a grade of C- or lower will not apply toward the minor requirements.
